

24-Hour Urine Collections – Patient Instructions (With preservatives)



Your doctor has ordered a urine test that requires you to collect all the urine that you pass for the next 24 hours. For accurate results, it is important to collect all your urine for exactly 24 hours.

Please read and follow the instructions carefully. Make sure you are prepared before starting the collection.

Contents of the kit:

- One 24-hour Urine Collection Patient Instructions Sheet
- One large orange container

Preparation:

- P1 Some tests require dietary and drug restrictions. Please check with your doctor before beginning specimen collection. It is important to check with your doctor before stopping or resuming any medications.
- P2 You may drink as much fluid as you normally would during the 24-hour collection period.
- P3 Plan your collection on an off day or over a weekend. If you plan to go out, bring the large orange container with you. If, for any reason, the urine collection must be terminated before the 24-hour period is up, empty the urine and start again on another day.
- P4 If several types of urine tests are requested at the same time and different preservatives are required, urine must be collected in separate 24-hour periods.

Collection Procedure:

Note: The collection bottle may contain a preservative. Do not discard it. Keep the collection bottle; closed and avoid direct sunlight light between each time you pass urine.

- C1 Start the 24-hour urine test by emptying your bladder. Do not collect this
- C2 For the next 24 hours, pass all urine into the orange container for collection.
- C3 If you wish to pass motion, empty the bladder first to avoid faecal contamination of the urine.
- C4 Keep the urine orange container in a cool place, and ensure it is closed and protected from light at all times.
- C4 <u>If your urine orange container is full,</u> continue to collect your urine into another collection bottle. If you do not have a collection bottle, a well rinsed, dry and clean plastic bottle can be used to collect urine.
- C5 On the next morning, exactly at the recorded start time (e.g. 8 am) urinate and collect urine into the orange container. After this, you can then stop the urine collection process. Record the "Stop date/time" on the urine orange container label. Cap the urine orange container and tighten the cap. If the urine leaks in transit, the collection will be invalid and the analysis will not be carried out.
- C6 Please return your completed urine orange container to the clinic.
